

## TIBOR HOLLO HONORED AS GLOBAL CITIZEN OF THE YEAR BY THE CITY OF MIAMI AND THE GREATER MIAMI HOST COMMITTEE

## Florida East Coast Realty Chairman and Founder Recognized for his Vision and Commitment to the City of Miami

MIAMI, FL – (January 19, 2010) – Mr. Tibor Hollo, Chairman and Founder of Florida East Coast Realty, one of South Florida's pre-eminent developers, has been selected by the City of Miami and the Greater Miami Host Committee as the "Global Citizen of the Year" for 2009.
