Florida East Coast Realty President and Founder Tibor Hollo was honored this week with the Urban Land Institute (ULI) Southeast Florida/Caribbean District Council 2010 Lifetime Achievement Award. Hundreds of South Florida's most prominent real estate professionals gathered at the Seminole Hard Rock Hotel in Hollywood for the ULI Southeast Florida/Caribbean 2010 Vision Awards.

The ULI SE Florida/Caribbean District Council bestows the Lifetime Achievement Award annually to an individual whose achievements throughout his/her lifetime exemplify outstanding personal, professional and civic contributions to the real estate industry and to our community at-large. "We are proud to announce Tibor Hollo as our ULI District Council 2010 Lifetime Achievement Award recipient. Hollo's fifty five years of visionary real estate development has forever changed the landscape of Miami. It is evident that the concept of living, working and playing in the urban core has been brought to life through his many developments," says James Motta, 2010 Vision Awards Jury Chair & President of Motta Group.

As Master of Ceremonies Spero Canton introduced Hollo, he stated "In terms of the development landscape, it is difficult to adequately describe the scope of Tibor's influence on his adopted home of Miami. His vision of developing a livable community in the heart of Downtown Miami can be measured

in tens of millions of square feet, much of it in iconic buildings. He has been called the 'Father of Downtown Miami real estate,' having been a vital force in the market for more than half a century." During his acceptance speech Hollo said he was "more than honored" to receive this award because he understands the importance of the ULI organization and its members and thanked his family and his employees. He concluded the speech by saying, "You gave me this award too soon...the best is yet to come!"
